A man who has lived well, laughed often with friends, gained the respect of those who knew him and the love of children.

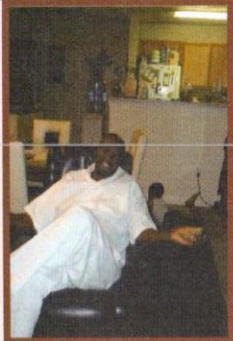
A man who has filled his niche and accomplished his task.
